

Application to Auburn University at Montgomery (AUM) School of Nursing

1. ***Before applying to the School of Nursing:*** Apply for admission to Auburn University at Montgomery www.aum.edu/admissions. Allow **at least four weeks** to complete this process.
 - ◆ Full admission to AUM is *required* to be eligible for application to the School of Nursing. Students on Academic Probation or Suspension and students with provisional university admission cannot be considered for admission to the Nursing program.
2. After full admission to Auburn University at Montgomery is achieved and most of the pre-nursing coursework is completed, submit the required ***separate*** application for the School of Nursing. There are two entry terms for Nursing – in the Fall and Spring semesters – and applications are available on the website www.aum.edu/nursingandhealth as outlined below.

3. ***Eligibility requirements for applying to the School of Nursing include (but are not limited to):***
 - ◆ Hold a GPA based solely on pre-nursing coursework and math/science GPA of at least 2.75 (unadjusted and without rounding) at the time of application
 - ◆ Receive full admission to Auburn University at Montgomery
 - ◆ For Fall admission:
 - Submit an official Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) score (73 or higher preferred) to the School of Nursing by March 1st (OR submit an official composite ACT of 27 or higher to the university Admissions Office by March 1st)
 - Have no more than 22 hours of remaining pre-nursing coursework to complete over the two semesters immediately prior to nursing entry
 - Have successfully completed (grades of “C” or higher) at least two (2) of the five (5) required lab science courses AND at least one (1) of the five (5) required lab science courses in progress at the time of application. (*A student who has earned two (2) grades below a “C” in Anatomy and Physiology I or Anatomy and Physiology II is not eligible to apply to the upper division of the nursing program*)
 - ◆ For Spring admission:
 - Submit an official Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) score (73 or higher preferred) to the School of Nursing by October 1st (OR submit an official composite ACT of 27 or higher to the university Admissions Office by October 1st)
 - Have no more than 18 hours of remaining pre-nursing coursework to complete in the fall semester immediately prior to nursing entry
 - Have successfully completed (grades of “C” or higher) at least three (3) of the five (5) required lab science courses AND the two (2) remaining required lab science courses in

progress at the time of application. (*A student who has earned two (2) grades below a “C” in Anatomy and Physiology I or Anatomy and Physiology II is not eligible to apply to the upper division of the nursing program*)

- Have successfully completed (grades of “C” or above) Anatomy & Physiology I w/lab and Anatomy & Physiology II w/lab within 5 years of nursing entry, or a retake of one lecture is required

4. *Please note:*

- The Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is a standardized exam on basic academic knowledge in reading, mathematics, science, and English that is used to assess the readiness of a student to adjust to a nursing program.
- Students with a composite ACT score of 27 or higher on file in the AUM Admissions Office are not required to take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS).
- Grades are counted *each time* a course is taken in calculating the GPA for admission to the nursing program; grade adjustments (“forgiveness” using either Grade Adjustment Program or Repeat to Replace Policy) are not considered.
- All pre-nursing courses must be completed with grades of “C” or higher
- GPA is not rounded.
- Students are strongly encouraged to take the Anatomy and Physiology I and II courses at AUM within one year of Nursing.
